



Did you give anything up for Lent this

year? Or perhaps, instead of giving something up, you took something on? Or maybe, with everything else going on in the world, you gave up giving things up?!

Whatever way you decided to observe Lent this year, the purpose of the season is to take stock, to come closer to God and to follow Jesus more closely as his disciples.



At Organic, our definition of a disciple is someone who listens to what Jesus is saying and puts it into practice. The original Greek word, "mathetes", literally means a "learner". However, this sort of learning is not about sitting in a classroom and filling our head with facts: it's about listening, watching, learning and putting into practice. It's less like school and more like an apprenticeship.

So how do we listen to God? There are so many ways. We may hear his voice when we read the Bible, alone or with others, when we hear a sermon or sing a hymn, when we have a conversation with friend or when we go walking on the fells. We might hear him when we read a book, or watch a film or when we sit quietly with our cuppa in the morning. On Sunday, at Breakfast Church we listened to God by looking at a range of pictures and then we shared what we thought God was saying through them. A strong theme of trust emerged, enabling us to be joyful people in a dark world.

So, as we approach Easter, let's stay attentive to God in our everyday lives and perhaps we could try new ways of listening to his voice. What will he say to us and what will we do in response? It could be exciting to find out.

Bus Talk

563 Penrith to Kirkby Stephen Bus Service



From Monday 31 March, the 563

bus service operated by Stagecoach will run between Penrith and Kirkby Stephen, Monday to Friday. Weekday buses will double in frequency to four to and from Kirkby Stephen and six to and from Appleby between early morning and early evening.

For the first time since 2016 it will be possible for Eden Valley residents to use the 563 to arrive in Penrth before 0830, enabling them to access education and work within office hours. Bus journeys into the Lake District will also become practicable. The last departure from Penrith will be at 1740.

The Saturday 563 service between Penrith and Kirkby Stephen will not be changed.

The revised timetables have now been published, available in paper form at Appleby TIC, or electronically at westmorlandandfurness.gov.uk/buses/563

561 Appleby to Kendal Bus Service

The 561 service resumed in January, operating on Wednesdays, running during off peak hours and giving users approx. 3 hours in Kendal.

It leaves Appleby Moot Hall at 9.30am and arrives at Kendal bus station at 10.30am and returns from Kendalat 1.30pm, arriving back at Appleby at 2.30pm.

The service is operated by Westmorland & Furness Council with a 16 seater minibus and although ENCTS permits will be eligible, the £3 fare cap will not, and normal ticket fares apply for anyone travelling without a permit.



Keswick School of Industrial Arts

A talk recently given to the Friends of Penrith and Eden Museum.

Many places have their iconic buildings - the Houses of Parliament in London, the Eiffel Tower in Paris to name but two. More modestly as befits its size, the former



Keswick School of Industrial Arts building sits where the River Greta flows close to High Hill in the town. The motto 'The loving eye and patient hand Shall work with joy and bless the land' which is still in evidence below the balcony on its exterior underlines its purpose.


At their recent meeting members of the Friends of Penrith and Eden Museum were further enlightened by Ian Bruce, author of The Loving Eye and Skilful Hand; The Keswick School of Industrial Arts (2001)which must rank as the definitive work on the subject.

The story began in 1884 with the establishment of classes in Crosthwaite Parish Rooms by the redoubtable Canon Hardwick Rawnsley and his first wife Edith, with the aim of alleviating local unemployment. Canon Rawnsley, together with John Ruskin, whose student contemporary he was at Oxford, enthusiastically espoused the Arts and Crafts movement. In the spirit of that movement the School at first taught woodcraft and repoussé metalwork, using copper and silver for the latter and eschewing brass, which being an alloy of copper and zinc was seen as 'impure'. A man of many parts, Canon Rawnsley, besides being the Anglican minister at St Kentigern's. Crosthwaite and perhaps best known to posterity as a co-founder of The National Trust was also a poet, a local County Councillor and the author of some forty books, many about religion but a good number about the Lake District and most with a thread of social conscience running through them. His concern for the poor was sharpened by earlier ministries in low-class areas of London; this was combined with his later love of the Lake District and determination that it should not suffer the blight of industrialisation.

The success of Hardwick and Edith's venture in Crosthwaite was such that from its start in 1884 with ten students by 1890 the School was winning prizes for its products and had nearer a hundred. Funding was raised by the Rawnsleys and in 1894 the building which still stands today in High Hill ,Keswick and thought to be a holiday let now, was in operation. In 1894 Harold Stable was appointed as its first Director. Continuing to use as his mantra what leader of the Arts and Crafts movement William Morris had said to him 'We must get the worker to delight in the use of his own hands and then to express his own natural desire to be shapely and harmonious in colour', Rawnsley's enterprise in its new home flourished, funded largely by the sale of its products. The underlying theme of these remained Celtic with some floral influence, also that of Greek vases.

Inevitably some students of the School broke away to form their own businesses, one such being William Henry Mawson, who left in around the turn of the century to start Keswick Home Industries, taking some other students with him. Over the years the School diversified, although still retaining its principle of purity of materials; The Langdale linen industry developed, as did wood-turning, also spinning and weaving as an acknowledgment of the part which women could play.

Remarkably perhaps, the School survived two World Wars, yet in 1984 it closed, beaten by a combination of poor marketing and the power of mass-produced competition. A fitting obituary for Canon Rawnsley, who died in 1920 was that by The Times - 'England would be a much duller place - a less happy and healthy country - if he had not lived and worked'. Almost certainly, the Keswick School of industrial Arts would never have existed



Where did your Easter egg come from?

Your Easter egg can be traced back to the early Church in Mesopotamia.

Since ancient times, people had been giving each other eggs at pagan Spring festivals, as eggs were a symbol of the new life and rebirth in nature all



around them. Then came Jesus and His death and resurrection, which made Easter the ultimate time for Christians to celebrate new life and rebirth. After that, it was only a matter of time before eggs found their way into commemorating Easter.

This seems to have first happened with the very early church in Mesopotamia, where those early Christians began dyeing their eggs after Easter, to celebrate the new birth that Jesus had given to them. The practice of using eggs in Easter celebrations then spread to the Orthodox Churches, and from there to the Western Churches across Europe.

Maundy Thursday, time to wash feet

Maundy Thursday is famous for two things. The first is

one of the final acts that Jesus did before His death: the washing of His own disciples' feet (see John 13). Jesus washed His disciples' feet for a purpose: "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you




must love one another." His disciples were to love through service, not domination, of one another.

In Latin, the opening phrase of this sentence is 'mandatum novum do vobis'. The word 'mundy' is thus a corruption of the Latin 'mandatum' (or command). The ceremony of the 'washing of the feet' of members of the congregation came to be an important part of the liturgy (regular worship) of the medieval church, symbolising the humility of the clergy, in obedience to the example of Christ.

But Thursday was also important because it was on that night that Jesus first introduced the Lord's Supper, or what we nowadays call Holy Communion.

Jesus and His close friends had met in a secret upper room to share the Passover meal together - for the last time. And there Jesus transformed the Passover into the Lord's Supper, saying, 'this is my body' and 'this is my blood' as He, the Lamb of God, prepared to die for the sins of the whole world. John's gospel makes it clear that the Last Supper took place the evening BEFORE the regular Passover meal, and that later Jesus died at the same time that the Passover lambs were killed.
