Things happen so suddenly that I find myself wondering if what I write now will still have any relevance by the time it is read. Like the rest of mankind, I'm wondering, today, what President Trump will do next, as the world's economic system tumbles down in confusion. Today, we tremble as he observes, with no sense of irony, that: "no other president could have done what I have done!"



The pages of history - the books of the Old Testament not least - are full of the exploits of men who have taken power to themselves with no regard for the welfare of the conquered. How will it all end? And what do I, just one among billions, matter? What can I do to alter the pages of history?

Perhaps we might learn that, as individuals, there is little of what needs to be done which lies within my power. But coming to some sense of my responsibility as I try to pray, I can believe that the small things do matter, and that it's all the small things which support what we call the big things. How many anonymous thousands does it take to support a field hospital in Ukraine?

It's perhaps too easy to shrug away the many terrible acts of wickedness which we have witnessed in this last century. After eighty years, still we are learning of new horrors committed during the Holocaust. Among the reasons for wishing away all memory of it is to banish from our minds the possibility of it ever happening again. Likewise. we might wish to reject the evidence that the perpetrators of the Final Solution were people just like ourselves. No wonder that our daily prayer must be: "Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on us sinners" and "Deliver us from evil".

As , at this time, we follow the fate of a good man abused and murdered, the Gospels leave us nowhere to hide. No room left for us to point the finger at our neighbours. When first we gain an inkling of the potential for evil which lies within us, we have either to reject and ignore that unwelcome accusation, or rouse ourselves to a life which is open to the awareness of love. A love which would free us to share in the joyful Resurrection which Beethoven celebrates in the climax of his Ninth Symphony. The Lord is risen. He is risen indeed!

# 563 Penrith to Kirkby Stephen Bus Service



Since 31st March, the 563 bus

service operated by Stagecoach now runs between Penrith and Kirkby Stephen, Monday to Friday. Weekday buses have doubled in frequency to four to and from Kirkby Stephen and six to and from Appleby between early morning and early evening.

For the first time since 2016 it is possible for Eden Valley residents to use the 563 to arrive in Penrith before 08.30, enabling them to access education and work within office hours. There is now also a late afternoon departure at 16.10 and a final departure at 17.40 from Penrith.

The Saturday 563 service between Penrith and Kirkby Stephen has not been changed.

## 561 Appleby to Kendal Bus Service

The 561 service resumed in January, operating on Wednesdays, running during off peak hours and giving users approx. 3 hours in Kendal.

It leaves opposite Appleby Moot Hall at 09.30 and arrives at Kendal bus station at 10.30 and returns from Kendal at 13.30, arriving back at Appleby Moot Hall at 14.30.

The service is operated by Westmorland & Furness Council with a 16 seater minibus and although ENCTS permits will be eligible, the £3 fare cap will not, and normal ticket fares apply for anyone travelling without a permit.

#### Post box in Appleby



This was also the age of Joseph Wright of Derby who painted the very spirit of the Industrial Revolution and the Enlightenment and whose paintings are still familiar to his many admirers to this day.





## Dying crops means food stops

Uncertainty looms over Indigenous farming communities in the Alta Verapaz region of Guatemala, Central America.

In this forested area of mountains and rivers, the livelihoods, traditions and very survival of farmers and their families are threatened by deadly droughts, savage storms and monster monoculture plantations.

That includes Amelia, a resourceful and determined 24-year-old farmer who lives with her husband and their two children, 8-year-old Lázaro and 4-year-old Yakelin, on ancient and beautiful land that's been in Amelia's family for generations.

The family belong to the Indigenous Q'eqchi' community, who are close, and live by a blend of Mayan and Catholic traditions.

Amelia's farm, first and foremost, feeds her young children. She tries to grow a

range of crops and root vegetables that will provide her children with a balanced diet, such as bananas, peppers and cassava. This way, Amelia can protect them from malnutrition.



The climate crisis is ravaging farms like Amelia's,

But the climate crisis is ravaging farms like Amelia's, causing both the dry and rainy seasons that would once arrive with predictability to intensify and shift erratically. As the river runs dry and water becomes scarce, the vital crops that Amelia depends on wither and die before her eyes. Amelia's ability to protect Lázaro and Yakelin is slipping away. Because dying crops means food stops.

'My first priority is to feed my family,' says Amelia. 'I worry about what my children will eat.'

These conditions are challenging enough, but Amelia and her community also have to cope with the impact of industrial plantations on their landscape.

Amelia's community, like so many others, have done little to cause the climate crisis but they are paying the highest price.

Despite these challenges, Amelia's faith keeps her strong. And her hope for a better future drives her to keep working to improve life for her family and community.

'I go to Catholic church,' she explains. 'For me, faith is very important, and a way for me to reach harmony in my life.'

#### **Pushing back**

As the community's farms are devastated, the search for solutions becomes critical. 'With high heat, there is little we can do but adapt,' says Amelia.

When Amelia discovered the work of Christian Aid's partner, Congcoop, she quickly put herself forward as a community representative who would attend the specialist agricultural training on offer.

With funding from Christian Aid, Congcoop support communities to return to Indigenous farming practices and adopt agroecological approaches that conserve their land, culture and livelihood. Agroecology, put simply, is farming in a sustainable way that works with, not against, nature.

By joining Congcoop, Amelia's gaining the skills and knowledge to cultivate native seeds that are better suited to the changing climate. She's planning planting schedules that will deliver multiple harvests throughout the year, making her own organic fertiliser, and constructing rainwater collection systems. By changing the way she farms, Amelia's pushing back against the climate crisis.

Amelia is recognised as a leader in her community. Whatever she learns, she shares - confidently training other women to adapt their farming practices too.

Whatever the future may hold, Amelia remains resilient. As Programme Officer, Gerardo C. Tobar, says: 'Amelia's story is one of resistance, and it's just beginning.'

The unstoppable power of hope compels Christian Aid and its amazing supporters to stand up for communities in crisis and support people living in poverty.



# May Day: unbridled merriment

May is the month when the ancient pagans used to get up to 'all sorts'! The Romans held their festival to honour the mother-goddess Maia, goddess of nature and growth. (May is named after her.) The early Celts celebrated the feast of Beltane, in honour of the sun god, Reli

For centuries in 'Olde England' the people went mad in May. After the hardship of winter, and hunger of early Spring, May was a time of indulgence and unbridled merriment. One



Henry VIII went 'maying' on many occasions. Then folk would stay out all night in the dark rain-warm thickets and return in the morning for dancing on the green around the May pole, archery, vaulting, wrestling, and evening bonfires.

The Protestant reformers took a strong stand against May Day, and in 1644 May Day was abolished altogether. Many May poles came down - only to go up again at the Restoration, when the first May Day of King Charles's reign was 'the happiest Mayday that hath been many a year in England', according to Pepys.

May Day to most people today brings vague folk memories of a young Queen of the May decorated with garlands and streamers and flowers, a May Pole to weave, Morris dancing, and the intricacies of well dressing at Tissington in Derbyshire.

May Day is a medley of natural themes such as sunrise, the advent of summer, growth in nature, and - since 1833 - Robert Owen's vision of a millennium in the future, beginning on May Day, when there would be no more poverty, injustice or cruelty, but harmony and friendship. This is why, in modern times, May Day has become Labour Day, which honours the dignity of workers. And until recently, in communist countries May Day processions were in honour of the achievement of Marxism.

There has never been a Christian content to May Day, but nevertheless there is the well-known 6am service on the top of Magdalen Tower at Oxford where a choir sings in the dawn of May Day.

There is something of a sadness about it, both in words and tune, as there is about all purely sensuous joy. For May Day is not Easter, and the joys it represents have always been earth-bound and fleeting.


